

In the event that a responding law enforcement officer will not cite the offending driver, the member may politely ask to speak to a supervisor. In the event that the responding law enforcement officer does not have an immediate grasp of the law, politely refer them to the sections of the law as listed on the BFW's flyer.

It is the policy of the KR Bike Club to avoid confrontation with drivers, passengers, other riders, or pedestrians while on club rides. Instead of direct confrontation, each member is encouraged to carry a copy of the pertinent bicycle ordinances, a reporting form, and a writing instrument on all rides, and to record pertinent information. Incidents should be reported to police in the event of accident or injury. Incidents of harassment, reckless driving, assault, etc. should be reported if you are willing to go to court.
